LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. _____ John 1:5

ear Family and Friends of St. Pius X,

The words of John 1:5 remind me of all that has occured since 2020. As the coronavirus pandemic spread, Hurricane Laura upended South Louisiana on August 27, 2020. Two days after the storm, I arrived at our church to survey the damage and salvage what I could carry in my truck. Devastation was everywhere. I was so busy visiting parishioners and helping others that I prayed Morning Prayer at 8:30 p.m. It was late, but I knew the Eucharist was our strength. I celebrated Mass at 9:15 p.m. and concluded the day with this prayer: "We simply need you to be with us, Lord. Help us to help each other as you teach us to do."

God answered that prayer. Our parish came together. From sunrise to sunset, hundreds of volunteers spent over a month handing out thousands of pounds of essentials in our parish parking lot. Many groups came from across the state and country to cook and serve more than 10,000 hot meals. The faith of our church animated and sustained everyone. On September 6, 2020, the twelfth day after Hurricane Laura, I wrote: "When it's dark outside, lights seem to shine brighter. Today, I am thankful for the darkness. It helps me see the lights." Since 2020, our parish has endured six natural disasters: two hurricanes, a flood, Winter Storm Uri, a tornado, and wildfires. Through it all, the light of faith shined through you as we came together in each situation.

The church helped us shine the light. Now it is our time to help the church. Our parish has grown more than 135% in 10 years. Weekend Masses are regularly filled, and countless times you've heard me say "We need a bigger church!" Rooted in faith, our parish wants to build a church to provide for current needs and future generations. We need a projected \$10 million in the next five years to build that church and nearly triple our current capacity to 575 people. I hope you will join me and our community to give back to God so the light of faith shines brightly for generations to come at St. Pius X Catholic Church.

PHASE 1: CHURCH

OUR GOAL

Our ultimate goal is to build the future of St. Pius Parish in three phases. Our immediate goal is to build a new church (Phase 1) large enough to serve our current parishioners and new community members who will move to Beauregard Parish in the coming years. In a 2023 feasibility study, St. Pius X parishioners overwhelmingly supported (98.5%) building a new and larger church, followed by classrooms, a new hall, and office. Once the new church (Phase 1) is completed, our goal will be to complete the classrooms next (Phase 2), followed by the new hall and office (Phase 3).

WHAT WE NEED

The total cost to build the new church (Phase 1) is a projected total of \$10 million. Our Phase 1 capital campaign goal is to raise \$5 million over the next five years towards the building of the church, with in-kind donations (\$1 million), building fund and parish savings (\$1 million), and loans (\$3 million) funding the remaining \$5 million. Raising \$7 million (Phase 1 stretch goal) towards the church over the next five years would provide substantial savings and allow us to construct the classrooms, hall, and office sooner.



ST. PIUS X PARISH ESTABLISHED



* WHERE WE'RE GOING

This capital campaign will allow St. Pius X to build a new church with seating capacity for nearly 600 people, along with the opportunity for additional seating as needed during busy liturgical celebrations like Christmas or Easter. Long-term, we hope to also build new office space to accommodate ministries, a larger multi-purpose building, adequate classroom space for our Religious Education program, and a cemetery. Once those additional buildings are complete, we hope to re-purpose the current space for the youth.




CHURCH FRONT • MAIN ENTRY



BAPTISTRY VIEW




AERIAL VIEW





CAMPAIGN PHASES

In a 2023 feasibility study, St. Pius X parishioners overwhelmingly indicated that building a new, larger church is the first priority, followed by classrooms, a new church hall, and an office. Thus, the capital campaign will be executed in the following three phases in order of parishioner priority:

We expect the new church (Phase 1) to cost \$10 million total. We can complete Phase 1 with funding from the capital campaign (\$5 million goal), in-kind donations (\$1 million), the building fund and parish savings (\$1 million), and a construction loan (approximately \$3 million). The more funds we raise through the capital campaign, the less debt our parish will incur.

FREQUENTY ASKED QUESTIONS



DO WE HAVE TO DO THIS ALL AT ONCE? CAN IT BE DONE IN PHASES?

Our plan is to build in three phases. The long-term vision for St. Pius X includes a church (Phase 1), classrooms (Phase 2), and a new hall and offices (Phase 3). This campaign will raise funds for Phase 1, the church. However, if we can raise enough to build the new church and other buildings at the same time, this would provide substantial savings. The cemetery project is currently underway and can be built with parish funds apart from the capital campaign.

WHEN WILL WE BREAK GROUND?

Thanks to generous support from a few talented parishioners, the site is ready. Once we have 50% of the funds in-hand and at least 25% more pledged, we can begin construction. Available funds may come from donations, in-kind support or loans, as needed.



HOW CAN I MAKE A FINANCIAL DONATION?

A capital campaign offers significant flexibility. Monetary donations may be offered as one-time gifts or pledged and donated over a period of up to five years. There are also opportunities to donate securities, stocks or other assets that also provide tax benefits to the donor. Finally, naming opportunities will be available for donors who wish to honor a family or individual. Simply fill out the intent form or scan the QR code to get started.



WHO WILL LEAD THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN AND MAKE FINAL DECISIONS?

Fr. Jeffrey Starkovich, as pastor of St. Pius X, will make all final decisions in cooperation with the Bishop and the input of the campaign committee, finance council, and pastoral council.

WHAT IS THE CURRENT FINANCIAL STATUS OF ST. PIUS X?

St. Pius X is in good financial standing. Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners and sound financial management, we have more than \$1 million saved for the new church. Throughout this process, our financial plans include maintaining a balance that could cover three to six months of operations so that parish ministry continues smoothly.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO THE CURRENT PARISH BUILDINGS?

After the new church is complete, the current church and current hall will provide flexible spaces for the parish and our ministries. After all new campaign construction is complete, the current buildings will permanently be dedicated to the youth.



We plan to replace the building fund collection with a capital campaign collection for the next five years. The building fund was started in 2020 to provide for construction and repairs. Because our capital campaign aligns with the purpose of the building fund, we will combine what is currently saved in the building fund with the capital campaign to achieve our goals. When the capital campaign is complete, the building fund will resume and continue to provide for ongoing maintenance.

HOW IS THIS DIFFERENT FROM MY REGULAR MONETARY GIFTS?

Regular stewardship offerings from our parishioners benefit the day-to-day ministry of the church. This capital campaign is a five-year fundraising endeavor to build a new church. We are inviting families to invest alongside their current general offertory by making a capital campaign pledge towards the construction of a new church building.
